As you are all aware, Ontario District will be hosting the 2024 LWML Canada National Convention on July 11th-14th, 2024 at the Four Points Sheraton in London, Ontario. All zones will be entitled to send a delegate to the convention as their representative who will vote on mission projects and any other matters which may require a vote. As such, each zone should forward to VP District Administration - Ontario the name, address, phone number and email address of their delegate and alternate delegate no later than

January 31st, 2024 so that they can be signed off and forwarded to our President and Recording Secretary. It is probably advisable to attempt to have these individuals selected by your Fall Rally if at all possible. Although parts of the National Convention may be virtual, delegates must attend in person in order to be able to vote. Information which requires voting on, will be forwarded to all the delegates starting at the end of February so it is essential that I receive your delegate and alternate names by the end of January.

You are also asked to forward individual names whom you wish to nominate to the various Board of Director positions. Lois Munz is the Ontario representative on the nominating committee and if you have questions or need assistance in nominating any individual, you can contact her. I would also be happy to assist in any way possible if you require such assistance. Let us ensure that we have a full slate of nominees for the various positions on the National Board.

We also have to prepare our Mission Grant proposals. If you want your favorite mission project from Ontario to be supported, you must prepare and submit a Proposed Mission Grant form to VP Christian Mission on or before October 15th, 2023. I would suggest that you submit your proposal sooner rather than later so that it is in Iris' hand well in advance to the meeting of the Mission Committee.

I want to say that the ladies of the Ontario District have proven that they follow our Mission Statement and I look forward to having the opportunity to gather with you at either one of your Fall or Spring Rally's or at our Christian Growth Retreat. I am so blessed whenever I have an opportunity to gather with our ladies at one of your functions and I hope that I will be able to attend at least one event within each zone before the end of my term next year.

The 2022 receipts and expenses of the LWMLC Ontario District Medical Missions have been verified and found to be correct as of Feb. 6, 2023 by Sandra Creed. The balance as of April 4, 2023 is \$55,089.71.

So later this month when his wife returns with their 2nd child to get the first set of immunizations, we will give her a baby layette. I snapped a quick picture of the father standing by the baby layettes after we unloaded them.

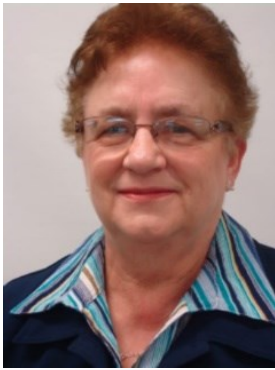
Theresa Wilson from Papua new Guinea wrote:

Our dear sister in Christ, Fran was called home to be with her Lord on March 14, 2023 in her 82nd year.

Fran was born on December 31, 1941 in Trail, British Columbia. She was baptized on April 19th, 1942 in Fruitvale, British Columbia and confirmed on June 22, 1955 in Fruitvale, British Columbia.

Fran married Irwin Roy Van Vorst on August 28th, 1965 in Fruitvale, British Columbia and they had two children; Michelle and Warren. Fran enjoyed the time she spent with her four granddaughters.

Fran and Irwin spent 32 years teaching in British Columbia and while in BC, Fran was involved with the LWML and served in her society as Secretary, Vice-President and President. As well Fran served as Christian Growth Chairman for the Okanagan Zone of ABC District and organized three LWML-C ABC District retreats for the Okanagan Zone ladies.

While in BC, Fran along with Irwin were involved in the local Christmas pageants for many years. Fran also filled the role of church choir director (1980/81). As well she and her husband hosted senior Bible Classes for many years.

Fran and Irwin relocated to Ontario in November of 1999 and joined Grace Lutheran Church in Oshawa where they were mandated to set up Grace Lutheran Day School. Upon arriving in Ontario, Fran continued to be involved with the LWML and served as Ontario District Mission Service Chairman, Ontario District VP of Mission Education and Mission Inspiration, Toronto Zone President and served a 6-year term, and Ontario District President.

Fran was also involved with LWML on the National level serving on the Christian Growth Committee and Mission Service Committee, as well as attending both the National and District LWML-C conventions.

Fran received a B.Ed degree and an additional special diploma in education majoring in primary education. She has taught ESL classes at the Okanagan College and VBS and Sunday School while living in BC. As well, Fran has written 6 resource books for teachers that were published in Canada and the US and has written many devotions for both retreats and conventions.

Fran's hobbies included, gardening, sewing, music, crafts and baking.

Most certainly the words, "Well done thy good and faithful servant" would apply to Fran.

A delicious noon meal was prepared and served by the Pastor of Peace Lutheran, Rev. Paul Schallhorn, and a group of men of the congregation.

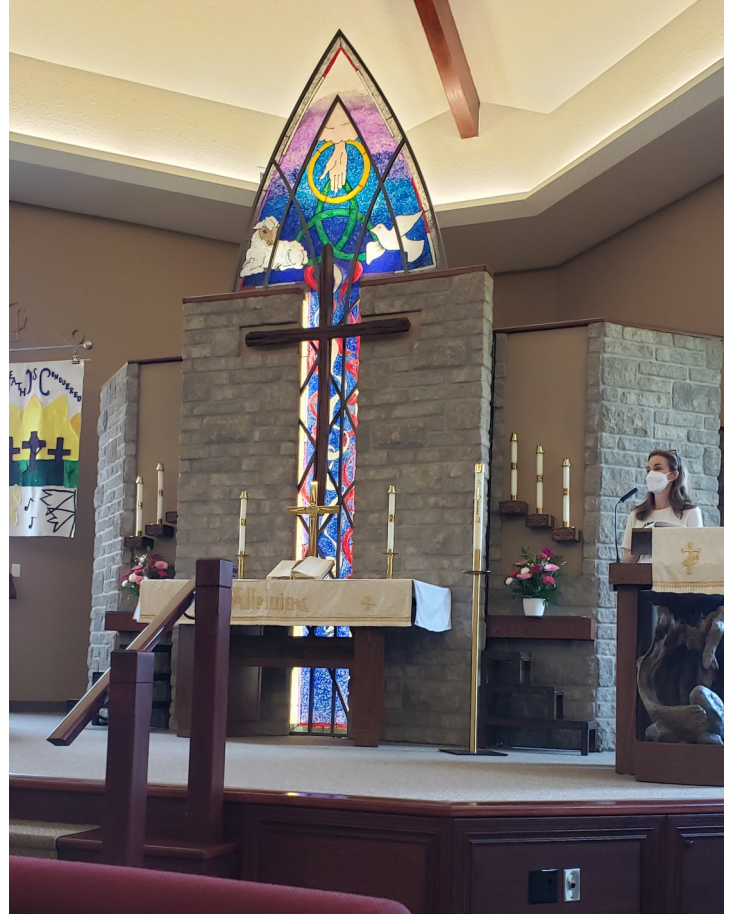

Used Stamp Program

Wondering what to do with your used stamps?
The Canadian Bible Society collects donations of used stamps.

Here's how our Used Stamp Program works:

Stamps collected from donations across Canada are combined to create charity boxes and are sold to stamp collectors and vendors.

The revenue generated from the stamps allow CBS to purchase Bibles for Canadian prison ministry.

10 lbs. of stamps = approximately 6 Bibles for distribution

Instructions for collecting:

- Keep the stamp on the envelope.
- Cut out the stamp leaving a 1/4 inch border around the entire stamp.
- Collect stamps on white or light coloured envelopes and not on industrial brown envelopes.
- Ask your church congregation to collect their stamps.
- Make a box as a collection vestibule.
- Ask to put an announcement in the bulletin about the program and to let them know how to collect and where the drop off location is.
- Ask the groups within the church (i.e. Women's Groups, Seniors Groups, Sunday School) to collect as a special ministry.
- We also accept personal collections that are already in books, binders, etc.

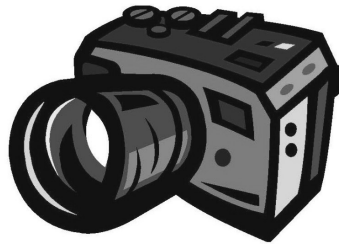


Niagara Zone

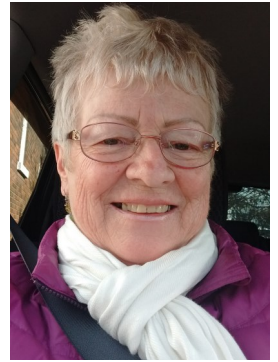
Niagara Zone

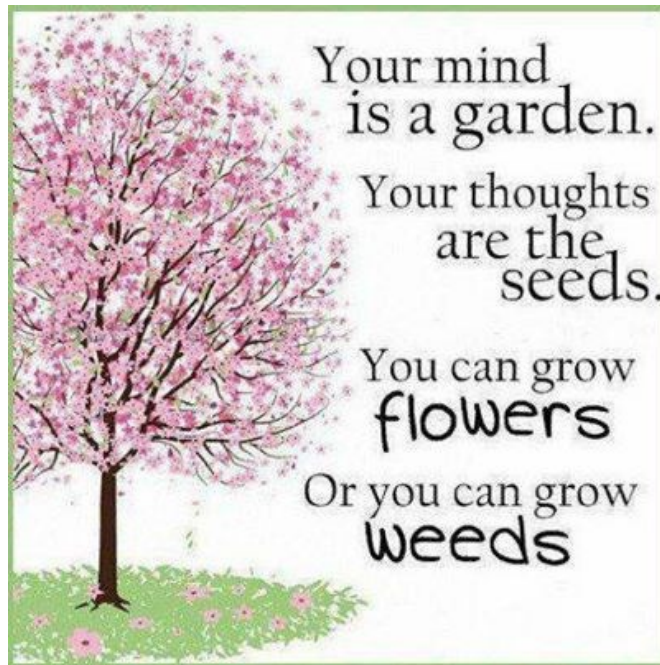

THE UKRAINE SHOE FEST PROJECT

Shoes, Shoes, Everywhere! God's blessings come in many forms. This time He blessed us with shoes! Lots and lots and lots of shoes! ... and slippers, and boots! The Ukraine project began in 2022 by utilizing unused space in the building of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Cobourg. The space quickly filled up with donations of gently used clothing, furniture, and various forms of house wares. Through social media, we invited our community's newcomers from Ukraine, and welcomed them to use this free resource as they came to "shop" for any needs they might have. The response was overwhelmingly positive as we invited these people into our church building and our church family. Around the beginning of the Lenten season, we became aware of a local family shoe business - Beebe's Boots - who after 90 years, and three generations in business, was closing its doors. They had a short time frame to empty their space and were looking for a worthy cause to



which they could donate their remaining inventory. They chose The Ukraine Project. Yikes! We didn't see it coming. For several reasons we could have said, "no thank you". Instead, we trusted God's hand in this very generous gift and sought His guidance to use it to serve our neighbour. The next day we received approximately 1000 pairs of high quality, new and vintage footwear. We humbly, and gratefully accepted this donation, moving it into our already limited space. There was no plan to distribute the footwear at this time and not all members were agreeable to the crowded space and musty smell this donation created, but we moved forward as God's faithful servants. We have this incredibly generous gift. Now what?!? An idea was born. Planning began and the execution to set up, advertise and open our doors for SHOE-FEST came to fruition within one week. The three-day Shoe-fest event was a huge success! Many of our Ukrainian friends came out to the event. There were smiles and hugs and catching up with them about their lives. They found shoes for themselves, for their spouse, for their children. Beautiful. New. Free. They found shoes! Surprisingly, the gift of shoes spread further than our own community. Through advertising within the Ukrainian community, we met representatives from the Ukrainian Consulate from



both Durham and Peterborough region. Through these contacts, shoes were shared with these regions which then offered them to those in need within their own community.

More than half the shoes found new forever homes through the Shoe-fest event, and yet several hundred pairs remained, taking up limited space in our fellowship hall. The hope was to find a suitable home for the remaining shoes before Easter. After reaching out to our local Children's Aid Society, a solution was found. Just a few days before Easter, a representative picked up the remaining shoes. The remainder of the shoes will be made available to children and families within the Children's Aid Society!

When this opportunity first fell into our lap, we had no idea how it would play out. God provided the opportunity. God provided the means. God provided the solution. So yes, God blessed us with shoes, and in doing so He blessed us with the opportunity to come together for a greater cause. To put others needs ahead of our own. To put our fears, opposition, and differences aside. He gave us the opportunity to pick up our cross and follow Him. Yes, God blessed us with shoes, but the blessings reach far greater than we realize. Thanks be to God!

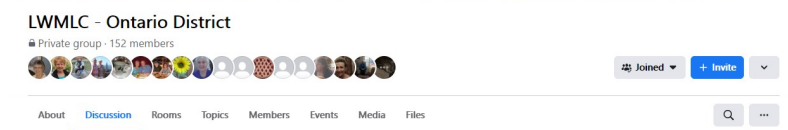




The League Pledge
